



## Sacred Heart Primary School PE and Sports Premium

At Sacred Heart Primary School, we believe PE & Sport to be an essential part of education for every pupil. We also believe that the provision of high quality PE and Sport has the potential to change young people's lives for the better and prepare them for a healthy life in the future.

At Sacred Heart, we aim to increase participation in sports and PE and develop healthy life styles by:

- developing a 'fitness for life' ethos across the whole school community
- aiming for each child to be of a healthy weight
- improving emotional health and well-being
- developing confidence in staff with the teaching of PE across the school
- promoting the importance of a healthy lifestyle to all pupils
- continuing to build on the legacy of the 2012 Olympics and recognise the importance of upholding the Olympic and Paralympic Values across the school
- encouraging competitive sport across the school through competitions
- promoting competitive sport outside of school

We have welcomed the Government's announcement in to provide additional funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. We are committed to using this resource in developing high quality PE lessons, alongside greater opportunities for sporting competitions and clubs for all our young people.

### Sport Premium Grant

Funding for schools will be calculated by the number of primary aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11) as at the annual census. All schools with 17 or more primary aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £8,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil. Smaller schools will receive £500 per pupil.

### What does the Sport Premium mean for my School?

'Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this' (DfE June 2013).

### Sport Premium spending 2013-2014

We used our PE and Sports provision this academic year to buy in specialist PE teachers, to deliver high quality PE in KS2, as well as purchasing a number of resources

### Sport Premium spending 2014-2015

This year we aim to develop the school staff and involve and increase number of children in school sports clubs. We also aim to run sport competitions and increase pupils' participation and run sports activities with other schools
