

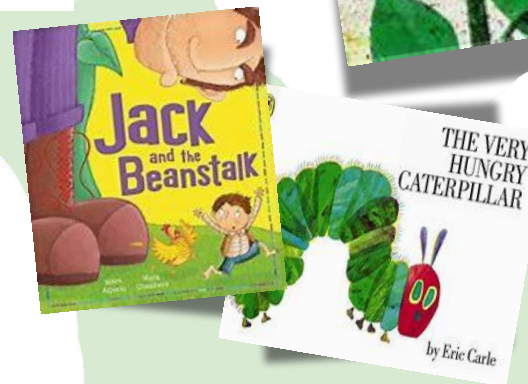

Possible activities-

Personal, social and emotional development

- Beginning to know that we think and respond in different ways.
- Talk positively about their own abilities.
- Confident to try new activities and use new resources.
- Show resilience and perseverance
- Forest school activities
- Buddy time

Communication and language

- Listen to and understand instructions
- Talk in front of others and join in conversations during activities and during play
- Ask questions like how, why and where
- Join in with repeated refrains in well known stories
- Join in with rhyming activities

Physical development

- Using wheeled toys- scooters and bikes
- Playing with construction large and small
- Go noodle
- Using large apparatus
- Fine motor activities
- Playdough activities – dough disco
- Squiggle while you wiggle
- Forest school activities

Literacy

- Read, Write inc sessions
- Reading for enjoyment and retelling own stories
- Ascribing meaning to marks made
- Letter formation
- Emergent writing/writing CVC words
- Writing own name
- Writing simple sentences
- Listening to stories and asking questions and talking about what might happen next, what the like/dislike
- Sequence a story using pictures or captions
- Know the difference between a fiction and non-fiction text

Mathematics

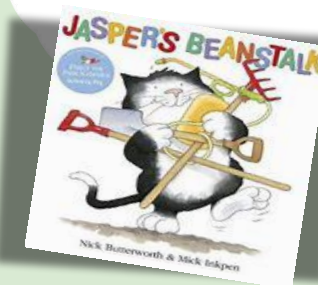
- Subitising
