Internet Safety – How safe are your children?

We talked to each year group about the apps and games that they are using on their devices. Please read this important information about the apps that the children in our school told us they are using.

SACRED HEORRT

Many children in school are playing Fortnite: Battle Rovale.

Fortnite is a multi-player, multi-platform, last player standing shooter game rated **PEGI 12 for violence**. Live Chat

Voice/text chat is available, but can be switched **off.** <u>Micro-transactions</u>

Fortnite is free to obtain but many in-app purchases are available. New items are released daily, but are only available for purchase for 24 hours.

It Can Be Addictive

Each game lasts 20 minutes – children find it difficult to stop a game halfway through as this affects their position in the game. Parents can use parental controls on the Xbox to limit game time.

Live chat

It's important to note that PEGI ratings do not take live chat features into account.


Children across school, including several in **Reception** and **Year 1**, are using the Live Chat features on games including Roblox and Minecraft to talk to total strangers. Some children in **Year 3** said they had played games including Call of Duty and Grand Theft Auto, both rated 18+, and had also used Live Chat features.


